

Moki Check

Moki's guide to loading the car

1 Buckle up

Not only occupants, but also luggage on the back seat can be secured with the seat belts

2 Width

For bicycle racks and the like, also consider the width of the car and the load: the permissible maximum is 2.55 metres

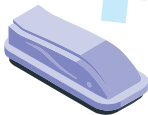
3 Checklist

With „Moki's guide to loading the car“, you're sure to pack things safely



4 Roof box

Only light objects belong in here – observe the permissible payload



5 Take a good look first

Before loading, have a look at all the luggage and determine the order in which it will be loaded

6 Tying down

Secure heavy luggage items with tension belts attached to the eyelets in the luggage compartment

7 Luggage net

Be sure to attach this if any luggage protrudes above the backrest of the rear seat



8 Rear window

Ideally, only load the luggage compartment to a level that ensures that visibility through the rear window is not impaired

9 Interior

Be sure to stow loose items in the compartments provided

10 Every day

Safety precautions don't just apply on holiday journeys, but always – for example when doing the weekly shopping

11 Cornering behaviour

When loading, always consider how the luggage might behave when taking a bend. Be sure to secure anything that might slip

12 Gaps

Pack luggage with as few gaps as possible, or fill the gaps with small items

13 Moki

says have fun packing, and enjoy the journey



14 Only take what's necessary

Before each journey, think about how much luggage you really need

15 Organiser

Ideal for stowing small and individual items

16 Item sizes

Several smaller pieces of luggage are often easier to stow than a few large ones

17 Quality

Pay attention to good quality when it comes to tensioning straps, luggage nets, bicycle racks, etc.

18 Tyre pressure

Be sure to check and adjust this when fully loaded



19 Centre of gravity

For the optimum centre of gravity and safety, load heavy luggage at the bottom and lighter items at the top

20 Luggage Tetris

Try out different combinations in the boot until everything is properly stowed



21 Risk of accidents

This greatly increases if the vehicle is packed incorrectly, let alone overloaded

22 Think ahead when loading

Pack everything that may be needed quickly in the upper layer of the boot luggage – for example first-aid kit, warning triangle and safety vests



23 Warning sign

Overhanging loads – for example bicycles on a rear-mounted carrier – must be marked with a suitable warning sign in Italy, Spain and Portugal



24 Check and re-check

It's better to check once too often whether everything is safely stowed away

26 Permissible total weight when loading

If this is exceeded, you can be fined up to 235 euros in Germany. But above all, road safety is at risk
